Why are fewer women than men from top universities in graduate level jobs?

A study by Oxford University's Careers Service has found a 'gender gap' in the jobs male and female university graduates from seven leading UK universities go on to attain within six months of leaving. It found that a significantly lower proportion of women than men are in graduate-level jobs.

Jonathan Black, Director of Career Services, Oxford University, commissioned the research and, based on new research into students' attitudes and behaviours, will talk about possible causes of the gender divide. He will discuss the implications, especially for women students, in how they plan their careers and that first step after Cambridge.

Jonathan originally read Engineering at Cambridge, has worked in California, London and Oxford; and across Europe. He is Chair of Minervation (an Oxford University spin-out company), and has been a Director of Modern Art Oxford and the Hackney Empire Theatre.
